
Canopic Jar



Egyptians believed they would need their body in the after-life.

Due to these beliefs they preserved the bodies of their Pharaohs by turning them into mummies when they died.

As part of this process they removed the internal organs and stored them in jars called canopic jars.

There were 4 jars that represented the sons of the God Horus

- Imsety had the head of a human and guarded the liver
- Qebehsenuf had the head of a falcon (shown left) and guarded the intestines
- Hapy had a baboon head and guarded the lungs
- Duamatef had a jackal head and quarded the stomach
