

Ancient Greek Ladies

The lives of women in Ancient Greece was very different to that of modern day. Women in Ancient Greece had very little freedom and were under the control of their husbands, fathers and brothers. They would marry at a young age, usually around 13 or 14 to a man chosen by their father. Girls didn't attend school and instead stayed at home and were taught how to spin, weave and look after the house by their mothers. They wore a "chiton" which was a loose-fitting gown made from big square pieces of linen.
